



A BRIEF GUIDE TO CALENDAR GIRLS

- The Women's Institute (WI) originated in Canada in 1897 and first appeared in the United Kingdom in 1915 in Wales. The intent of the British formation was to revitalize rural life and encourage food production during the First World War. Since then, membership has grown to over 200,000 members in 7,000 chapters.
- Yorkshire (formerly the County of York) is the largest county in northern England. It borders the North Sea to the east. "York" comes from the Viking name for the city and "Shire" is from Old English meaning care or official charge. Early settlers were the Celts, who were displaced by Viking invaders around 866 AD.
- Wharfedale is one of the Yorkshire Dales in the upper valley of the River Wharfe.
- Although "Jerusalem" is not the official song of the WI, its long use as the opening song of meeting and conventions has cemented its association with the WI. The lyrics have a message that the women's suffrage movement identified with and was deemed appropriate for the WI's encouragement of women to take an active role in public life. The song itself is based on a William Blake poem from 1804 with music by Sir Hubert Parry in 1916. It has been adopted as a hymn by many churches and its popularity has lead it to become an unofficial national anthem. It opened the 2012 Olympics in London.
- Tai Chi is a Chinese martial art that is practiced for both its defensive training and medical benefits. Its origin is sometimes linked to Taoist or Buddhist monasteries, but the actual beginnings are unknown.
- Westlife was an Irish boy band that performed from 1988 until 2012. They sold over 50 million records during their career with 14 number one singles in the UK.; however, they only managed to have one hit in the US in 2000.
- Ripon Cathedral was started in the 7th century and has been rebuilt four times. It is famous for its musical traditions and its church organ.
- Maltesers are candy with malted insides and a chocolate coating around the outside. They were originated in 1936 and marketed as energy balls and a slimmer for women. They are similar to the Whoppers candy in the US.
- Boots is a UK-based pharmacy (chemists) chain that was established in 1849. It now has over 2,500 stores.
- Tesco, a British retailer founded in 1919, was primarily a grocery chain until moving into general merchandise in the 1990s.
- Marks & Spencer is a UK, high-end retail chain established in 1901. It became famous for selling only British-made goods but relented from this in the 1990s.
- A fête is a traditional public festival, typically held outdoors for a charity.
- Sunflowers can grow to a height of six feet and will tilt towards the sun until they reach maturity.




