

Director's Notes


When I was asked to direct this production, the first thing I told my colleague and scenic designer, Scott Campbell, was, "All I want is Richard Nixon's face to be really, really big." This may seem like a frivolous request, maybe even simple at first glance, but that statement drove us to one of the most collaborative, complicated and exciting production experiences that I have ever had. I wanted to give the TLT audience a fresh experience on this stage and Morgan's script, which silently demands the blend of live theatre with live television, was the perfect vessel for us to achieve a production brimming with innovation. The most remarkable aspect to this piece of theatre in particular, and I hope you will agree after vou see the show, is that even in the 21st century, when the internet has crushed television as media's giant, and despite our bold multi-media set of projection and live cameras, this play proves that in the end theatre will win. I hope that you enjoy the technical magic of this production, but more so I hope that you will find the most fascinating features of FROST/NIXON to be the story, the words, the real characters, and Morgan's unabashed ability to mix history with fictional drama for a piece of theatre that is both whimsical and quietly chilling.

Peter Morgan, who primarily works as a screenwriter (The Queen, The Last King of Scotland), felt that this story was one that was meant for the stage. He knew that of all the forms of entertainment, theatre is the vehicle to tell the story of the redemption of two larger-than-life men and force audiences to reflect on the ever-shifting boundaries of politics in the media. Unlike other forms of media, in this play (and in most theatre) there is no one to tell you what to think. Instead we are providing you with a good story and an opportunity to decide for yourself what you think of these hallmark events in history and how they have shaped the nation and the world today.



I hope that not only do you find the events in this play fascinating and informative of our current world, I also hope that we succeed in entertaining you with Morgan's brilliant script, which has been sprinkled with my own quirky sense of humor, stars a terrific cast, and has the support of the best production team ever. All in all, I hope FROST/NIXON provides you with a great night at the theatre. Please stick around for a talkback after the show. Ask us your questions and give us your thoughts. 


