





They manage to persuade four fellow Women's Institute (WI) members to pose nude with them for an "alternative" calendar, with a little help from hospital porter and amateur photographer Lawrence. The news of the women's charitable venture spreads like wildfire, and hordes of press soon descend on the small village of Knapeley in the Yorkshire Dales. The calendar is a success, but Chris and Annie's friendship is put to the test under the strain of their new-found fame.

Just in time for Halloween comes everyone's favorite 80's cult horror comedy!

Five college students go to an abandoned cabin in the woods and accidentally unleash an evil force that turns them all into demons. It's all up to Ash (a housewares employee turned demon-killing hero) and his trusty chainsaw to save the day. Blood flies. Limbs are dismembered. Demons tell bad jokes ... and all to music. This show has fun with the horror genre and, in doing so, appeals to a wide audience. It's the only show with a "Splatter Zone"—a section of the audience that gets covered in fake blood. A hilarious, quirky, and thrilling alternative to your standard holiday entertainment.







The order comes through Jonah's girlfriend LaBelle, whose investment in the outcome is intensified by her pregnancy. Both plot the murder, even as Jonah's relationship with the strict but caring Dawson develops, and his imagined visits with her dead son jar his conscience.



But when they need one another most, will they be able to find courage in each other? This funny and touching story captures the delicate, sometimes fractured bonds between mothers and daughters, husbands and wives, and lovers, both old and new.

Set in 1999, young American hero Raymond Shaw is decorated for saving his troops in a peace-keeping mission in the Middle East. He returns to the U.S. to find his wealthy widowed mother has married the rightwing racist Senator John Iselin. Their goal of reaching the White House gets closer and closer as a game of solitaire figures prominently in the murder of everyone who blocks their way. As a tightly wound plot of espionage, brainwashing, and ruthless ambition unwinds, Raymond Shaw doesn't appear as the war hero everyone thought he was.

TLT's classes help students of all ages to grow to their full potential as performers, and more importantly, as human beings! TLT's vision is to allow students to step into our classes and camps to learn new techniques and theatrical styles that will help them fully thrive as theatre artists and also supply them with skills they need for life.

Our classes are designed to enhance homeschooling curriculums, as well as build upon traditional schooling by bringing the importance and value of art into students learning a consistent routine.

TLT is excited to further our mission of enriching our community with quality live theatre experiences. Come join the fun!

After-School @ TLT (enrollment begins August)

These wonderful six-week sessions are held either Mondays & Wednesdays or Tuesdays & Thursdays (Students can enroll in both sessions) from 4:00pm-6:00pm during the school year and culminate in a fully staged play or musical production for friends and family to come enjoy. Classes are open to students in grades 1-9.

Homeschool @ TLT (enrollment begins August)

Modeled on our after school program, this class is designed for the homeschool families in our community. These classes take place over a six-week period, and culminate in a fully staged production for friends and family to come and enjoy. Tacoma Little Theatre is a certified Community Based Instructor (CBI). Classes are open to students in grades 1-9.

Improv (times vary)

Learn the skills necessary to think on your feet and say "Yes, and...". These tools help young and adult actors with their onstage skills, as well as off stage in school and work. Classes vary from evening to weekend times; please be sure to check our website for the latest specifics on class time. Classes are available for 11-18 year olds and adults.

Voice Lessons (times vary)

Need to brush up for an audition? Looking to learn how to sing? TLT is happy to partner with several wonderful voice teachers who will schedule a time for your private one-on-one lesson in our studio. Students will perform in two recitals during the year to showcase their talent. Lessons are available for all ages.





Dance (times vary)

Getting ready for an audition or just wanting to build on some current skills? Come join us for these fast-paced classes. Classes offered at a variety of levels and skill sets: ranging from the basics of ballet, jazz and musical theatre; to more intensive specific styles of musical theatre. Students will spend 6 weeks focused on a specific style or skill set, ending on the final class with a showcase of what they have learned. Classes are available for all ages.

Adult Classes @ TLT (times vary)

TLT has extended our education program to include our adult actors. These programs start for students 18 and up, they include classes in intro to acting, advanced acting, improv classes, and dance classes. Check in to see what's available online or email education@tacomalittletheatre.com

SUMMER CAMP @ TLT (enrollment begins in Winter 2020)

We host an intensive four week summer program, designed to immerse students in all aspects of the Performing Arts. Camp is available to a large range of ages and skill sets. TLT has found that being in a larger group, students are able to learn from each other no matter their ages or skill levels. Camps are open to students entering 1st-12th grades.

- -Students learn and work on audition materials for the production, including: acting audition, dance audition and vocal audition.
- -Students spend three and a half weeks learning all the music, choreography, and character work needed for the performance.
- -Students participate in set work, ranging from costume creation to set painting.
- -Students participate in workshops to help strengthen their acting skill set. Past workshops have included: stage combat, vocal training, improv work, character work, and many more.
- -Students end the final weekend of camp learning the technical process of putting on a show.

Students On Stage

Our outreach program is designed to bring the entire educational experience to your school! Our programs range from a variety of musical and non-musical options, all designed to bring the importance and value of art into students learning. TLT will supply instructors, minimal sets, costumes and props to your school. You and your school will coordinate enrollment, rehearsal and performance space, and other school support. Previous shows have included Wizard of Oz (non-musical), Alice in Wonderland, and Jungle Book Kids.

- -Students will spend 5-6 weeks rehearsing the production
- -All programs end with a single performance or weekends worth of shows.
- -Students will learn new techniques and theatrical styles to will help them as artists and also supply them with skills for school and beyond.



Sophie

From her earliest childhood, Sophie used to write about things and events and people that interested her, and as she became older,

she often wrote as well about her own thoughts and feelings. This one-act show takes place at an outdoor railway station, where a young Sophie (age 13) talks with her older self (age 19).

This 45 minute touring show provides a fantastic educational and artistic experience for students of all ages. We are excited to start bringing this performance around to local schools in the Puget Sound.



Next summer will be filled with the sounds of construction as we remove all the old seats, take out the floor, and completely change the layout and entrances to the theatre.

Here are the exciting things that you can expect when we debut the auditorium in September of 2020.

- Brand new seats with cupholders and five inches of padding
- New carpet and flooring with larger aisles
- A new seating chart that gives everyone the best seat in the house
- An improved ADA section that offers better comfort and access to our patrons
- A new projector and screen for special events
- Improved sound and lighting
- An Assistive Listening System (ALS) for our patrons who may need it

- 3. Flex Passes can be used however the patron prefers. There are 6 punches available.
- 4. Once reservations are made with the Flex Pass, there are no refunds, but we offer an exchange for no extra fee.
